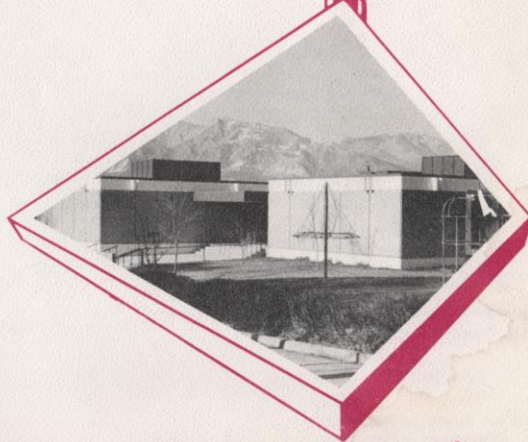

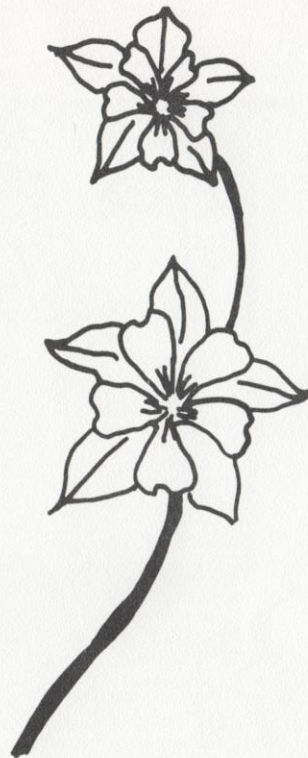

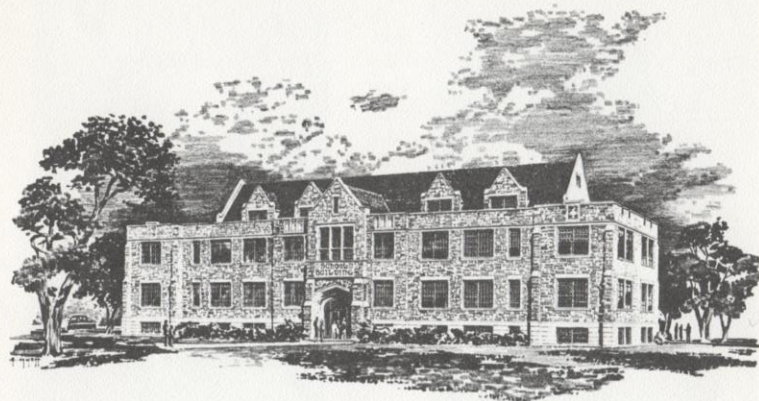
Foreword . . .

this last, fond tribute to our school.

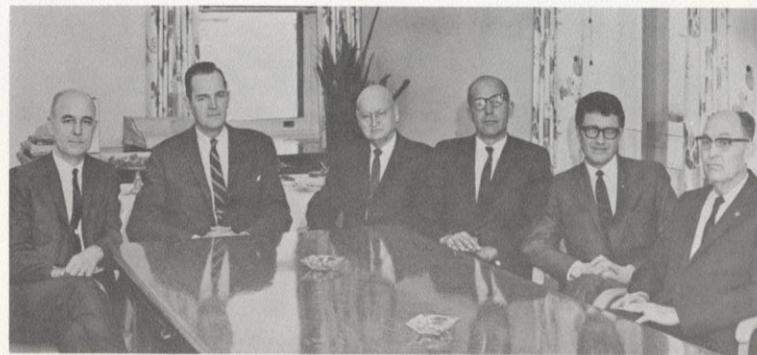
