

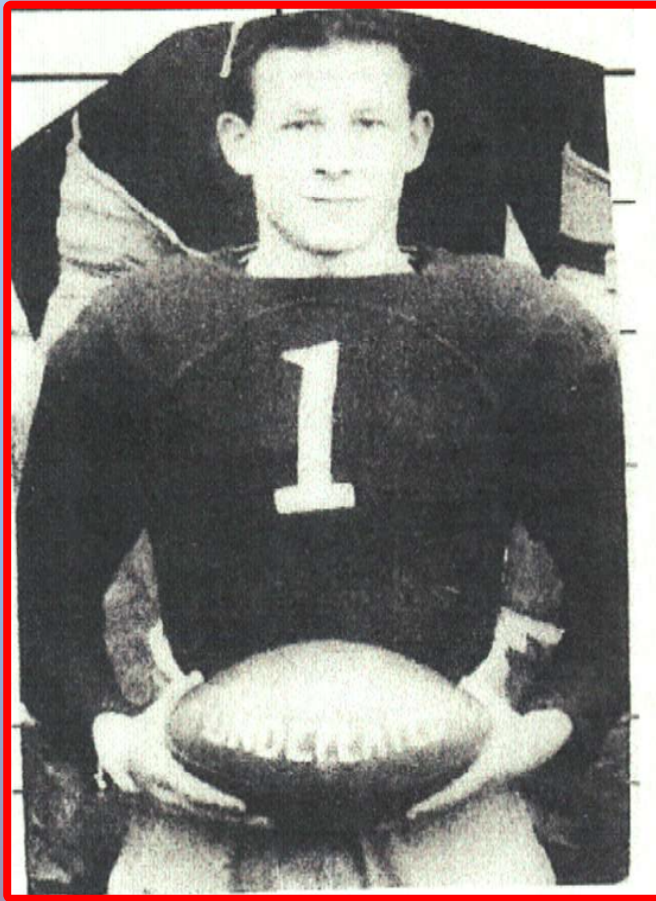
## Hall of Fame -2010



**Thomas Carson - 1970**

- \* Lettered 4 years in football, basketball & track 1965-1969.
- \* Black Forest League All-Conference in football - '68
- \* Deaf Prep All-American in basketball (special mention sophomore) -'67
- \* Deaf Prep All-American in basketball (second team) - '68
- \* Deaf Prep All-American in basketball (honorable mention) -'69
- \* 2 time Black Forest League All-Conference in basketball-'68 & '69
- \* National Deaf Prep Trackfest:
  - best 3rd in one-mile relay -'67
  - best lead in 440 yard dash -'68
  - best 7th in 440 yard dash (52.5) -'69
  - best lead in 880 yard run (1:56.4) -'69
- \* 3 time state qualifier in track - '67- '69
  - 4th place in the 1-mile relay - '67
  - 5th place in the 880-yard relay - '68
  - State Runner-up in the 440 yard Run & 880 yard run - '68
  - State Champion in the 440 yard Run & 880 yard run - '69
- \* Set then-school records in track:
  - 440 yard run (51.6) -'68
  - 880 yard Relay (1:36.2) -'67
  - One-Mile Relay (3:41.0) - '67
- \* Holds school records in track:
  - High Jump (5'10") -'67
  - 880 yard run (1:56.4) -'69 held his two previous records in school.
- \* 1-time Deaf Olympic qualifier - '69 in track 800m (gold medal) 1-mile relay (silver medal)

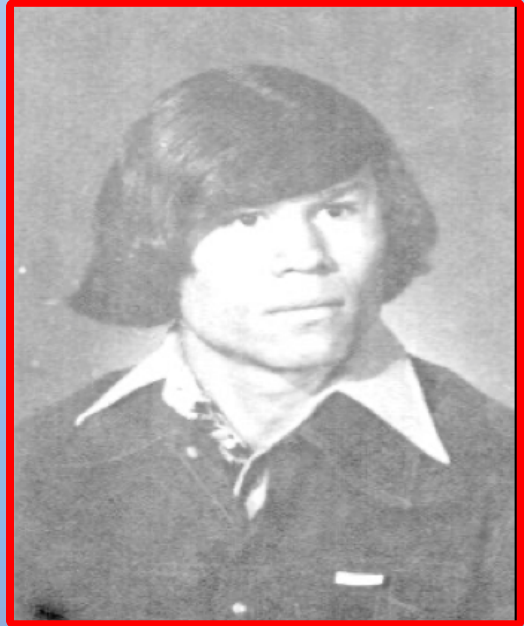


**Thomas Fischer – 1941**

- \* Lettered 4 years in football & basketball 1939 -1942.
- \* Football Team Captain -1940 & 1941
- \* Quarterbacked the '40 and '41 football teams and led his team to the undefeated season under Coach Alfred Brown in 1941.
  - 1939 with a record 5-1
  - 1940 with a record of 3 -2
  - 1941 with a record of 7-0

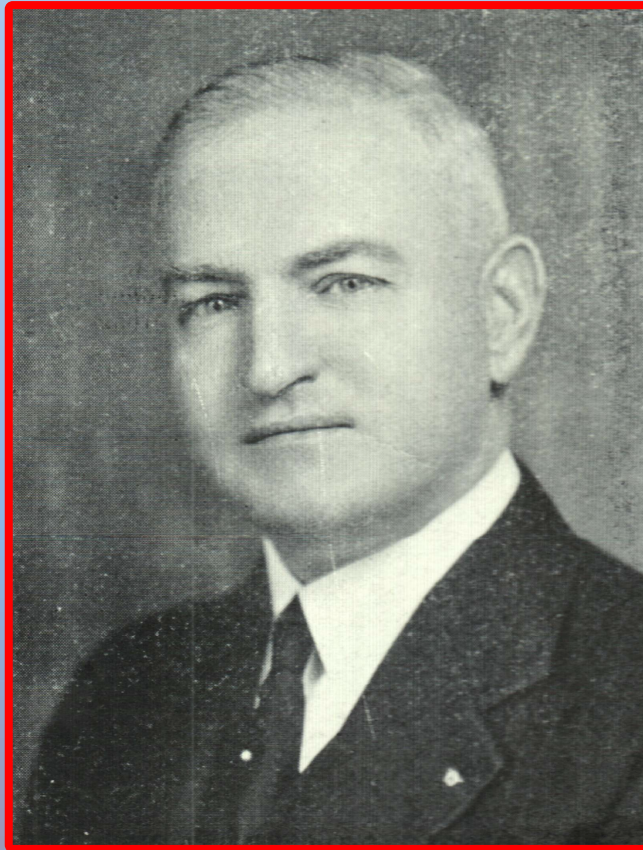
## Hall of Fame -2010

### Jesus A. Contreras -1977



- \* Lettered 4 years in football, wrestling and track - '74 - '77
- \* 2-time Black Forest All-Conference in football (Halfback) -'75 & '76
- \* Was a member of the wrestling teams which won champion in district. -'76
- \* 4-time Black Forest League Wrestling Champion -'74, '75, '76 & '77
- \* 4-time District Wrestling Champion -'74, '75, '76 & '77
- \* 4-time State Wrestling Qualifier -'74 to '77
- \* State Champion in wrestling -(112 Lbs)-'74,' (119 Lbs.)- 75 & (138 lbs.) - '77
- \* State Runner-Up - '76
- \* 4-time Gazette Telegraph Class A-AA Team First team in WR - 74-77
- \* Career wrestling victories - 107 wins and 3 losses, 973% in the 4-year span
- \* Gazette Telegraph Wrestler of the Year - '77
- \* All-American in wrestling - '77
- \* Colorado Wrestling Class A Most Outstanding Wrestler - '77
- \* National Fraternal Society for the Deaf Athlete of the Year - '77
- \* Three time district qualifier in track - champ in one mile run -'75 & 2nd place -'76
- \* 2 time state qualifier in track - '75 & '76
- \* 2-time Deaf Olympic Qualifier -
- \* '77 in wrestling (silver and bronze medal)
- \* '81 in wrestling (silver medal)
- \* Inducted into the USA Deaf Sport Federation Hall of Fame in wrestling -'98

## Hall of Fame -2010



**Coach Alfred L. Brown 1912- 1954**

**\* Coached football for more than 4 decades Had the most victories in school's history 3 undefeated seasons 1920, 1925 & 1941.**

**\*9 time 1-loss seasons - 1919, 1921, 1924, 1927, 1932, 1939, 1940, 1944 & 1950**

**\*Had several players inducted into H.O.F during Brown's coaching career Was the school's principal/superintendent for 42 years.**
