

Oscar White - 1920

He was a key member of the 1920 undefeated football team under Coach Alfred Brown's era. He was the two-time captain, 1919 and 1920.

He did not only star in football but also in basketball. He led in scoring during his senior year.



Frank Dyers- 1920

He was an older brother of Lou who was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2009. He starred in football, basketball and baseball. He was an integral player in the 1918 – 1920 teams.

He was part of the school's first undefeated football season in 1920. After graduation, he signed and played baseball for a semi-pro baseball team in Brooklyn. Unfortunately, he died in a plane crash which ended his baseball career.



Fred Wise- 1927

He starred in both sports – football and basketball for 7 years. He was a twotime member of the undefeated football teams in 1920 and 1925.

According to the school's Index, he was the most versatile player during his playing days. He played with other HOF inductees, Louis Byouk and Louis Dyers. In 1927, he was asked to coach his team while the coach was out with a serious illness.



Paul Hubbard-1889

He was part of the inaugural football program at the school in the mid-1880s. After he graduated from the Colorado School for the Deaf and the Blind in 1889, he went to Gallaudet University to continue playing football. He played football as a quarterback at Gallaudet University from 1892 to 1895 and he was credited with inventing the huddle.

He was inducted into the USA Deaf Sport Federation Hall of Fame (FB Coach) - '53
